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How to find the University of East Anglia (UEA) and Norwich

UEA is easily reached by road, rail and air. It is particularly well served by the rapidly expanding Norwich International Airport and is only 110 minutes by train from London. The city is a major regional centre that attracts many thousands of visitors each week to enjoy shopping and social activities in the city.

UEA is located on the south-west side of the city (virtually at the end of the main A11 from London). Despite its parkland setting it is just over two miles from the city and has regular bus services throughout the day and night.

By car from London take the M11/A11; just outside Norwich take the A47 (Southern Bypass) in the direction of Swaffham; the University is signposted off at the next exit. If you are driving from the North or the Midlands, you can use the A47 via King's Lynn, or the new A14 as far as Newmarket and then take the A11 to Norwich. UEA is situated on the outskirts of Norwich, around two and a half miles west of the city centre, just off the Earlham Road (B1108) which is one of the main roads out of the city. Parking is available on campus at UEA on a ticket or pay and display basis, any participants with special needs will be able to park beside the Sainsbury Centre

By air Norwich Airport has regular flights to and from Aberdeen, Amsterdam, Edinburgh and Manchester, and international connections to 200 cities worldwide through regular direct flights to and from Schiphol Airport in Amsterdam. The easiest way to reach UEA from the airport is by taxi (journey time c. 20 minutes; fare £10-12). Flight enquiries: (+44) (0) 1603 411923

By bus and coach National Express coaches run from all major cities in Great Britain to the Surrey Street Bus Station in the city centre. Buses 25 and 35 run regularly from the city centre to the university campus (journey time 20-30 minutes). Bus and coach enquiries: (+44) (0) 845 300 6116. By train Norwich is less than two hours from London by train and there is an InterCity link with the Midlands, the North of England and Scotland via Peterborough. Trains run from London Liverpool Street approximately every half hour. The easiest way to reach UEA from the station is by taxi, which costs about £8.50 and takes approximately 15 minutes. There are regular buses direct to the University from the station forecourt (numbers 25 and 35); journey time 25-40 minutes. Rail enquiries: (+44) (0) 8457 484950.

GETTING TO THE ELIZABETH FRY BUILDING

The Elizabeth Fry building (EFRY, F4 on campus map) is located on Chancellor's Drive across from the Medicine, Health Practice and Policy building (H2 on the campus map). It is a short walk from the Sainsbury Centre for Visual Arts (A4). All teaching rooms in Elizabeth Fry are accessible. The building has two entrances. From Chancellor's Drive, the **entrance to the Foyer** over level ground is by revolving door and two side doors. From the car park, the entrance is also over level ground. An elevator is available and is to your left on entering the building from Chancellor's Drive and to your right on entering from the car park. Lecture Theatre 01.02 is off the car park. Accessible toilets are located on floors 0, 1 and 2.
